
Beginning Genealogy

Presented by Della M. (Hansel) Gamalski

Della grew up in Flint and graduated with the Flint Northern Class of 1960. She moved to Milford and lived there until 2018 when she moved back to Flint. She is a lifetime member Milford Jaycettes, past President of Flint Genealogical Society and a 20 year volunteer at the Family History Center in Howell. Della is current Treasurer for the Flint Genealogical Society and a volunteer at Grand Blanc Area Museum.

Della has been researching family since age 12 and serious research began in 1986. She has been to family villages in Luxembourg and Poland. While Della was searching for family records in Poland, she found that the Russian Occupation Army had destroyed all civilian records. Della was told by her guide that she could try local churches as they had hidden their Baptism, Marriage, and Death records from the Russians. There she found some names that led to local families who welcomed her into their homes and answered her questions. They filled gaps in her ancestral tree. Plus, they told her many stories of family members long gone.

This evening's program will be "FINDING YOUR ROOTS", Genealogy 101: How to start your search with fun. The program is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be available and a door prize will be drawn.

The following advertisements appeared in the Flushing Observer in 1949:






